

27. THE DAY OF ATONEMENT



1. **LEVITICUS 23:27-28**
The Day of Atonement was the most important yearly event in the Jewish calendar
2. **LEVITICUS 16:2**
Only the High Priest could enter The Most Holy Place and only on this day
3. **LEVITICUS 16:3-6, 11**
Aaron was to prepare for the event and bring a sacrifice for his sins
4. **LEVITICUS 16:7-8**
Two goats were presented, one for the Lord and the other was to be a scapegoat
5. **LEVITICUS 16:9,15**
The goat for the Lord was to be offered as a sacrifice for the sins of the people

6. **LEVITICUS 16:15-16**

Its blood was to be sprinkled on the mercy seat in the Most Holy Place

7. **LEVITICUS 16:20, 24, 30, 33**

Symbolizes the final cleansing of sin from the sanctuary and nation

8. **LEVITICUS 16:10**

The scapegoat was released in the wilderness and left to die

9. **LEVITICUS 16:21-22**

This symbolized the guilty party paying the penalty for its sins

10. **LEVITICUS 16:29-31**

It was a time of solemn reflection to ensure sins were confessed

11. **LEVITICUS 23:29**

Whosoever did not 'afflict their souls' (confess, repent) died instantly

12. **HEBREWS 2:17**

Jesus, our High Priest, makes atonement (reconciliation) for our sins
